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## What is Child Find?

Child Find is a statewide network program that operates on behalf of children with disabilities. The Child Find network assists in identifying and providing help to disabled children throughout Georgia.

## Does the child demonstrate difficulties in any of the following areas?

### DEVELOPMENT

- Little or no movement
- Shows no interest in toys
- Physically overactive or passive
- Clumsy, makes lots of mistakes
- Limited strength, vitality or alertness

### BEHAVIOR

- Restless/Need for constant movement
- No understanding of real dangers
- Experiences drastic mood swings

### SELF-HELP

Children develop at different rates. Most children will show steps toward independence during toddler years. Some concerns may be:

- Does not try to feed self
- Rarely expresses wants or desires
- Depends on others to care for needs

## Help is Available

Special services are available to eligible infants, children, and young adults identified with a disability in one or more of the following areas:

- Physical Impairment
- Deaf or Hard of Hearing
- Visual Impairment
- Deaf-Blind
- Mental Retardation
- Behavioral Emotional Disturbance
- Learning Disability
- Speech and/or Language Delays
- Autism
- Health Impairment
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Cerebral Palsy
- Down Syndrome
